

BARRY CITY COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING  
JULY 6, 2015

Mayor Rennecker called the regular monthly meeting of the Barry City Council to order at 7 p.m. He then led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance. All elected officials were present.

Steve Schultz made a motion to approve the June minutes and Bruce Kendall seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent.

Steve Schultz made a motion to approve payment of the bills and Jeff Hogge seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent.

Mayor Rennecker amended the agenda to add the following:

"Open bids for Merry-Go-Round" and "Confirm New Library Board Member".

Tyler Young was the only one that put in a bid for the Merry-go-Round that was formally in LaFayette Park. The bid was in the amount of \$25. Steve Schultz made a motion to sell as is to Tyler Young for \$25 and Debbie Harshman seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent.

Council received request to confirm new Library Board Member. Jimmy Hodges appointed Miranda Dunn to replace Cindy Schwadlenak who recently moved to Texas. Debbie Harshman made a motion to confirm Miranda Dunn to the Library Board and Steve Schultz seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent.

Officer Lowry from the Pike County Sheriff's Dept. gave the police report. There were 7 arrests: 3 misdemeanor arrests and 4 traffic arrests. Bruce Kendall stated that at past two meetings they were asked to watch the stop sign by Pratt Street and Greene Street. Officer Lowry said it was hard to park where people cannot see them.

Debbie Harshman gave report on Parks and Zoning Committee Report. They had discussed a brewery that is planning to open in Barry. A brewery is not currently an allowable use under B-1 Zoning so they would have to amend the B-1 zoning code to include microbreweries and wineries. Council will also have to amend CLASS W liquor license to include the business. Debbie said the owners want it to be family friendly and will be selling gluten free food items as well as beer.

The Committee also inspected the pool and dividers in the girls shower room need to be removed, the front doors are in bad shape and painting needs to be done. Umbrellas and plastic tables were discussed so people would be able to sit in shade. Also, the pool vacuum head and hoses need to be replaced. Quote for the pool vacuum head and hoses were \$165. Scott Harris said that benches at Farm Supply were \$168. Debbie Harshman made motion to approve purchasing the items and Jeff Hogge seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent.

Cindy Galinis from Tiny's Place requested a 3- day Special Event Permit for the Apple Festival. This will be behind Tiny's Place as long as she has permission from adjoining businesses. Bob Dieker made a motion to approve the request and Debbie Harshman seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent.

The Council received a donation request from Barry Apple Festival. Allen Flynn said they are looking for sponsors for the Apple Festival. There are three levels of sponsors: Golden Apple Sponsor - \$2500

Red Delicious Apple Sponsor - \$1000 - \$2499

Jonathon Apple Sponsor - \$500 - \$999

Steve Schultz recommended donating \$500 to the Barry Apple Festival and Bob Dieker seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays 0 absent.

Melvin Gilbert said the golf coach asked if the City would be willing to put a team in for the school golf tournament for the school golf team. Hole sponsors are \$50 and \$25. Steve Schultz made a motion to give \$25 for hole sponsor and Jeff Hogge seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent.

Melvin Gilbert said they are trying to catch up with the mowing and was asked if could tree down in front of Lamberson House. We put culvert in driveway and cut ditch out. Debbie Harshman asked about other trees in town and Melvin said they will be later this year.

Lance Kendrick said the houses are all down and we have deed for Haskins property. Also worked on code enforcements and the annual USDA water report. The auditors were here for two days.

Council discussed the revised police contract. The new contracts annual cost will be \$50,227 and are asking the City to purchase a vehicle which would be equipped by the Sheriff's dept. The cost for the car would be \$23,000 - \$26000 and purchased by 5/1/2016. Hopefully a grant will help cover the expense of car. The contract ends on November 30, 2018. Bob Dieker made a motion to approve the police contract and Scott Harris seconded the motion. Roll call taken:

Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent to approve the police contract.

Council discussed the sand filter cleaning contract. A bid of \$8500 was received to clean both sand filters and we would need to haul in fresh sand. Jeff Hogge made a motion to approve the contract and Bruce Kendall seconded the motion. Motion carried with 6 ayes, 0 nays and 0 absent.

Comprehensive plan goals were reviewed and several of the goals have been met.

Steve Schultz made a motion to go into executive session to discuss litigation and semi annual review of minutes. Bruce Kendall seconded the motion. Council went into executive session at 8:07 p.m.

Council returned from executive at 8:35 p.m. No action was taken.

Bruce Kendall made a motion to adjourn and Steve Schultz seconded motion. Meeting adjourned at 8:36 p.m.
